AWOL BRIEF to churches



Purpose

The purpose of this document is to equip the local churches of Empangeni, Richards Bay and surrounding areas with information about AWOL so that they can promote AWOL and encourage their people to become passionately involved.

About AWOL & its History

AWOL first began in 2009 when churches partnered together and hosted the first event with 130 teenagers who shared God's love in the community of Empangeni and surrounding areas for a whole week. A volunteer team of 165 adults from local churches got involved and almost 4000 hours of community work were achieved. To date, AWOL has invested 21 503 hours of community service through the willing hands of 945 teen campers! AWOL now draws on a team close to 200 staff and volunteers from churches in Empangeni, Richards Bay and surrounding areas each year — more than the number of campers! As the hours invested into the community have accumulated over the years, AWOL's focus has shifted towards the teens and making an impact in their lives with each successive event.

Teen Camp Experience

Teens will camp in tents at **Heuwelland Primary School** from **Tuesday 25 to Friday 28 June**. AWOL aims to provide opportunities for teens to make a Godly difference in their community. On certain days, teens leave the event site and participate in various projects in surrounding areas that have been organised by a number of local churches mainly from Empangeni and Richards Bay and surrounding areas. These projects also contribute towards community engagement hours that teens are required to accumulate for their Life Orientation Portfolio by their matric year. The teens also have ample opportunity to make new friends and have fun at the event site. Each evening there is awesome praise and worship as well as spiritual input. There are also structured activities and sessions that develop the teens. The camp is limited to 200 teens. All teens are welcome however they must be in high school and no more than 19 years of age. The cost for the entire event is R600,00. Separate documents titled **AWOL Camper Info** and **AWOL Registration Form** have more detail and can be found on our website.

The Local Church Experience

AWOL encourages members of local churches to get involved and exercise the gifting that God has placed in them. There are many areas to serve on AWOL either in the build up to the event or on the event itself. Help is needed during the day as well as after hours. It is a good way to connect with people from other churches who share a common vision to impact teenagers and the surrounding community with God's love. AWOL desires to be a catalyst to encourage churches to make an ongoing difference – far beyond the week of the AWOL event. A separate document titled Where can I serve on AWOL? has more detail.
